

Noida International Airport and Bird Academy Create hospitality employment pathways for local youth in Jewar

Jewar, September 17th, 2026: – Bird Academy, in collaboration with Noida International Airport's CSR programme, Brisk Olive Trust, and Roseate Hotels & Resorts, the hospitality brand of Bird Group, India, has successfully completed a hospitality skill development programme for local youth in Jewar.

The programme was designed to support employment-oriented skill development for young people from communities around Noida International Airport and help them access opportunities linked to the region's growing aviation, hospitality and services ecosystem. Conducted at ITI College, Jewar, the programme trained 33 students from different backgrounds who had completed Class 12. It covered key areas of hospitality operations, including Front Office and Food & Beverage, along with soft skills, industry interactions and exposure visits to hospitality facilities. The training focused on practical capabilities, workplace readiness and confidence-building among participants. Following completion of the programme, candidates have moved into employment opportunities across the region, including at Noida International Airport, Roseate Hotels & Resorts, and outlets along the Yamuna Expressway.

The hospitality programme builds on an earlier collaboration between **Bird Academy and Brisk Olive Trust**. Last year an aviation skill development programme was conducted at ITI College, Jewar, for 28 students from underprivileged backgrounds. The programme focused on aviation ground operations, including ramp operations and passenger handling, along with soft skills, airport exposure visits and interactions with industry professionals. Candidates who completed the programme have since secured employment opportunities at Noida International Airport.

The **Aviation Skill Development Centre at ITI College, Jewar**, was inaugurated last year by the Hon'ble Member of Legislative Assembly of Jewar - Shri Dhirendra Singh, with support from Noida International Airport. The centre is intended to equip local communities with skills aligned to employment opportunities emerging from the region's aviation and logistics ecosystem.

Christoph Schnellmann, Vice Chairman, Noida International Airport, said: *'Noida International Airport's development is closely linked with the communities around it. Supporting local youth with relevant skills and access to employment opportunities is an important part of our commitment to the region. We are encouraged to see participants from these programmes move into employment, and we will continue to work with partners on initiatives that strengthen employability and support inclusive regional growth.'*

Mrs. Radha Bhatia, Chairperson, Bird Group & Bird Education Society for Travel & Tourism (BESTT), added: *"The belief that skill is the most powerful enabler of opportunity has driven everything Bird Academy has stood for since 1998. In a world where graduation and post-graduation alone no longer guarantee a rewarding career, focused skilling is what bridges education and employment. Empowering women has always been central to our mission, because when you empower a woman, you empower an entire family, and in turn, a community. We believe in gender parity, and that every young woman deserves equal access to skill and opportunity. Seeing them step into meaningful careers alongside their peers, is the very purpose. I would like to express my sincere gratitude to Mr. Christoph Schnellmann and the Noida International Airport team, and to the leadership of Brisk Olive Trust, for giving Bird Academy the opportunity to positively impact 61 lives. This is just a curtain raiser, one that showed us what is possible when institutions, industry, and communities come together with shared intent. Aviation and hospitality are among the fastest growing pillars of India's economy, and demand a skilled, world-ready workforce capable of delivering world-class experiences. We look forward to sustained and strategic public-private partnerships that place our youth, our communities, and our nation firmly at the centre of this growth story."*

The initiative is part of Noida International Airport's broader CSR focus on education, vocational training and employability. As the airport and the surrounding ecosystem develop, such programmes aim to help local communities participate in economic opportunities emerging in the region.
